Ashburn Farm Assessments & General Information

Collection Policy

Assessments are due the first day of each month. Any installment of the annual assessment not paid to the Association within thirty (30) days after the due date shall be considered delinquent and a late charge of \$25.00 shall be assessed to the Owner and posted to the Owner's account every thirty (30) days delinquent.

Home Sales

Effective July 1, 1989, the Virginia General Assembly enacted a new law entitled the "Virginia Property Owner's Association Act". This act required the seller of a home to make certain disclosures to the intended purchaser of their lot. All home sales in Ashburn Farm are subject to the Virginia Property Owner's Association Act. A written request of the Association Disclosure Package and a check in the amount of: \$225.00 for an electronic disclosure (via email) for townhome/single family; \$250.00 for a paper disclosure for townhome/single family; \$100.00 for electronic or paper disclosure for condo; are required to begin processing. A rush fee of \$50.00 may be paid to receive your disclosure within 3 days. Checks should be made payable to the Ashburn Farm Association. A form is available on the website or at the Association office. The completed package will be issued within 14 calendar days to the requesting party or agent. For further information, please contact the Association office.

Steps to Take for a Complete Yard Clean-Up in the Fall

As the weather gets colder, windier, and more unpredictable, it's time to start thinking about indoor fun. Fall is the perfect time to start locking down your outdoor space until next year. Make sure you're done by checking everything off this list:

1.Pet Solid Waste Removal

Do you have pets? If so, they've probably left you with at least a few unwelcome gifts on the lawn. Yard waste removal should be the first step. So, get out there and scoop the poop.

2.Leaf Removal

Do you have a leaf blower or rake? It's time to clean up the fallen leaves. Either blow them from your lawn with a blower or rake them into a pile and bag them up. Don't dispose of them just yet. Leaves, and other green waste, can make valuable compostable material which your garden will need come spring. If you don't choose to compost, make sure you use biodegradable leaf bags.



3. Weed Elimination

If your lawn and garden have any weeds, now is the time to get rid of them. Either spray or pull any remaining weeds before winter so they're not waiting to pop up next spring. It will also save you from spraying as much pre-emergent, helping to preserve an organic lawn and making weed control next season much easier.

4. Lawn Mowing

Next, it's time for one last mow. The final mow of the season should be cut a bit shorter than usual. There's a chance your lawn is still growing, and you want to give it a little room for this, but it also helps with the next step.

5.Aeration

Proper aeration will keep your lawn healthy by giving your grass "room to breathe." If you notice your ground has a spongy feel, and it's a cool-season species, now is the time to aerate. However, if your groundcover is a warm-season species, the right time to aerate is in the late spring.

6.Overseeding

If your lawn was even a little sparse this year, and you're working with a warm-season species, you need to seed it now. Your final mow was just done. So, now you can add some seeds (and water). This ensures a fuller lawn next spring.

7. Fertilization

A crucial part of lawn care is fertilization. And, this time of year, right before or right after your overseeding is complete, is the right time to feed. Read and follow the instructions on your fertilizer packaging for the best results.

8. Mulching

Some of your perennials will require mulch to keep the roots from freezing in cold weather. Here are a few options:

- » Use some of the leaves you collected from your yard
- » Mulch clean yard debris/ branches
- » Purchase pre-made mulch at your local garden store
- » After you've chosen a mulching material, cover the topsoil with a layer that serves as a blanket from the frost. Take care that some air can still move through the mulch to prevent mold.

9. Seed Storage

If you have any seeds in your garden that you would like to save for next year, now is the time to collect them. Make sure to let them dry completely before you place them in any type of airtight container. Label

Special Trash Pick-Ups

Spring cleaning, buying new furniture or appliances, moving or have tenants moving out? everything, and put it in a safe place, ready to plant next spring.

10. Gutter Cleaning

Do NOT forget to clean out your gutters. If they're still full of leaves in the winter, the weight of any snowfall can tear them from the side of your house. Not only will the gutters need replacing, but this can damage your roof and siding as well.

11. Clutter Removal

It's time to clean up your messes. If you have any of the following laying around, now's the time to pick it up and put it into storage.

- » Toys
- » Birdhouses, baths, feeders, etc.
- » Lawn ornaments
- » Planters
- » Patio & deck furniture
- » Gazebo covers
- » Trash and debris piles

Once you've cleaned up your junk and have it in a safe place, it's time to move on.

12. Power Washing

Now that everything has been cleaned up from the yard, it's time to power wash your decks, fences, and your home, if needed. If you don't have a power washer, use a sprayer nozzle on your garden hose and get to work.

13. Tool Winterization

Some of your lawn and garden tools might have been



put away when you were removing clutter from the yard. Now, you're almost done and the final step is to winterize your lawn equipment.

- » Lawn mower
- » Weed Eater
- » Rototiller
- » Anything else with an engine that won't be running for awhile

And, when you've got it all winterized and stored away, you're finally ready to sit back and relax.

Final Thoughts

Not everything on this list applies to every yard. For example, you may not have trees to prune or seeds to store. Still, you can use this as a guide to make sure you nurture a beautiful and healthy yard.

Patriot Disposal's Frequently Asked Questions

Patriot Disposal is the Association's Trash Collection service provider and is under contract until February 2024 and includes twice per week trash collection and once per week recycling.

Regular Trash Collection occurs

Mondays & Thursdays from 7 AM – 6 PM.

Regular Recycling occurs Thursday only from 7 AM – 6 PM.

Yard Waste Collection, Mondays

March 1 to December 31 (Yard waste placed at the curb January & February is disposed of as trash.)

Special Pick-up – Items must be scheduled with Patriot Disposal 1 (703) 257-7100. Please send an email to Covenants@afhoa.net to notify the Association that your special pick-up has been scheduled and include the date of the pick-up.

LOUDOUN COUNTY REGULATIONS PROHIBIT THE COLLECTION OF THE FOLLOWING:

Liquids of any kind, asbestos, ammunition, fuel tanks, hazardous waste, infectious or medical waste, petroleum-contaminated soils, radioactive waste, dead animals, manure, acids, caustics, explosives, or other dangerous items, or any items too large or too heavy to be safely loaded.

What items are unacceptable for collection from the curbside?

Regular household trash is refuse generated as a result of normal everyday living in the home. Some materials do require alternative methods of disposal. For a list of acceptable vs. non-acceptable materials, please visit the County website at https://www.loudoun.gov/127/Waste-Management or the Association website at https://ashburnfarmassociation.org/trash-storage-collection/ for more details.

What do I do if I have a large item to dispose of?

Small furniture made out of fabric and/or wood and bed frames may be put out for collection with your regular trash. However, larger items such as furniture, mattresses, carpet and appliances require special handling. Please call the office to set up a special pickup, additional fees may apply.

Patriot Disposal is prohibited from collecting carpet, plywood, 2x4s and other items that are considered to be construction debris with the regular trash. If you have any items for collection that are the result of remodeling

or rebuilding, please call the office. We may be able to schedule a pick-up of these items for an additional fee.

What is yard waste?

Yard waste is defined as grass clippings, leaves, or bush/hedge trimmings resulting from normal maintenance of your yard. Please place your yard waste on the curb in brown paper yard waste bags or un-bagged in a personal container clearly marked 'yard waste' on both sides of the container.

Yard waste bagged in clear plastic bags will be collected, however we prefer the use of brown paper bags or a personal container. Although plastic bags are currently accepted, they are not biodegradable and lead to issues with the machinery at the compost facility.

Patriot Disposal will also collect tree trimmings so long as they are cut into four-foot lengths, with each limb or piece of brush no larger than four inches in diameter and tied in small bundles with rope or twine. Each bundle can be no larger than two feet in diameter.

Yard waste does not include stumps, rocks, dirt, sod, gravel, mulch, whole trees, or clean-up from storm damage. Collection of these items may be provided for an additional charge. Customers who have any of these items for removal should contact our office for an estimate. Patriot Disposal collects yard waste that is on the curb throughout the entire year in accordance with County regulations. For more information about set-out requirements and pickup days please contact our office.

Can I get an additional trash container?

An additional 96-gallon, 64-gallon or 32-gallon trash container can be rented from Patriot Disposal for a one-time fee of \$45.00, which can be paid over the phone with a credit card or debit card.

What should I do if my trash or recycling container is missing?

Please check with your neighbors to see if someone has accidentally claimed your container as their own. If you are unable to locate your container, please call the office and request a delivery for a replacement container. The following additional fees apply:

- 96-gallon container for \$75.00
- 64-gallon container for \$50.00

What if my trash container is broken?

You may call or email us to assess the container. If the container is broken and can be fixed, we will schedule a day with you to come out and repair it. If the container is broken beyond repair, we will schedule with you a day to replace said broken container.





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Graffiti in Your Neighborhood

:writing or drawing made on a public structure without permission; or usually unauthorized writing or drawing on a public surface

Ashburn Farm has experienced a growing issue with graffiti within our common areas. Our goal is to immediately remove graffiti when it occurs. Members are encouraged to do their part by reporting and taking steps to deter vandals in Ashburn Farm.

Here are some recommended steps for dealing with graffiti:

1. If you happen to see someone defacing property, don't try to stop it yourself.


Call the police immediately (703-777-1021), is the non-emergency number) and report a vandalism in progress. Make a mental note of as many details as possible about the perpetrators including how many, what age, male or female, and any distinctive clothing that will help the police identify them.

2. Encourage your neighbors to also watch for and report graffiti vandals.

It's important to look out for each other in our neighborhood, and one way of doing this is to notify your neighbors and board members about any graffiti you see or vandals you observe.

When graffiti appears on property in the homeowners' association, photograph and report it.







gain more notoriety the longer the graffiti remains. Reporting it to us as soon as possible allows us to act quickly and sends a message that you care about the Ashburn Farm community.

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

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
